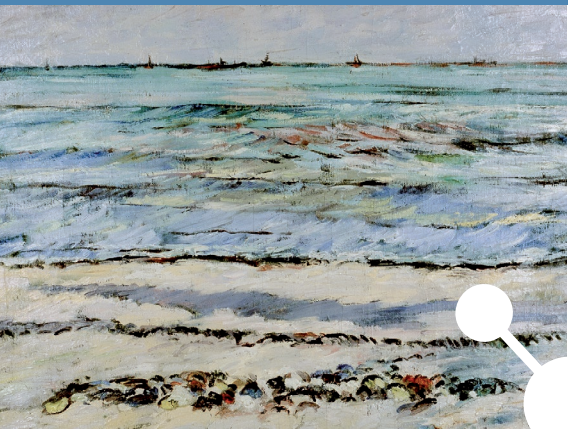

euroart – the European Federation of Artists' Colonies – came into being in 1994. It was founded in Brussels under the auspices of the European Parliament and the European Commission. **euroart** currently consists of about 70 member organisations, associated organizations and personal members, in 13 European countries: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania, Netherlands, Norway, Poland and Russia. The members hold exhibitions together, exchange views, knowledge and artists. And in annual meetings, next to keeping each other informed of developments in their several colonies, they all work together towards a greater cultural understanding and cooperation in a European context.
